

Every event in our programme will have a payment gateway: please click the 'School' and 'free ticket' options. You will be sent an email confirmation for each event you book with an event link.

PLEASE NOTE: Each teacher watching events should have their own account and book the events they will be watching. Event links will be unique to each registered user – and users will have to login on the day to use the link and watch events.

Click through from your email event link OR find the event in the 'Event Search' and tune in with your class (new users will have to create an account and go through the payment gateway to watch events).

If there's a Q&A option for that event, type your pupils' questions into the Q&A box at any time during the session – selected questions will then be passed on to the author via our moderators.


