In this event, Joan's literary agent Lindsey Fraser and colleague Jenny Brown are joined by other contemporaries and admirers, including Teresa Breslin, Alan Taylor, and Bridget England, one of Joan's daughters, to celebrate Joan's amazing life and legacy.
